SAT/ACT Combo Practice Test

The SAT/ACT Combo Practice Test is designed to help students decide what test, SAT or ACT, is right for them. Welcome, lords and fair ladies. Join us for night of games and fun inspired by the art, music, and culture of the Renaissance. Feel free to wear a costume! Please register.

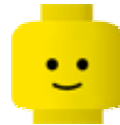

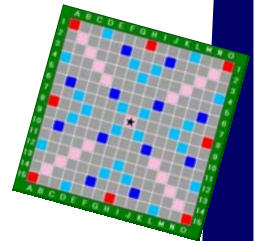

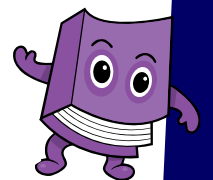

Toddler Storytime

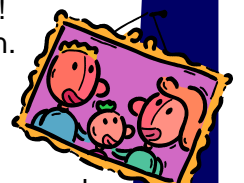
