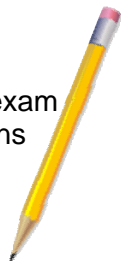

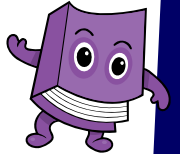

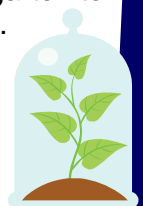

The 2010 Census is a count of everyone living in the United States and is mandated by the U.S. Constitution. **Census data are used to apportion Congressional seats to states, to distribute more than \$400 billion in federal funds to tribal, state and local governments each year and to make decisions about what community services to provide.** The 2010 Census form will be one of the shortest in U.S. history, consisting of 10 questions, taking about 10 minutes to complete. Strict confidentiality laws protect the respondents and the information they provide. The Mount Laurel Library is pleased to participate in this process as a Questionnaire Assistance Center from March 19 to April 19. Citizens can come to the QAC to have questions answered or pick up a Be Counted questionnaire if they did not receive one at their place of residence. **BE COUNTED!**
