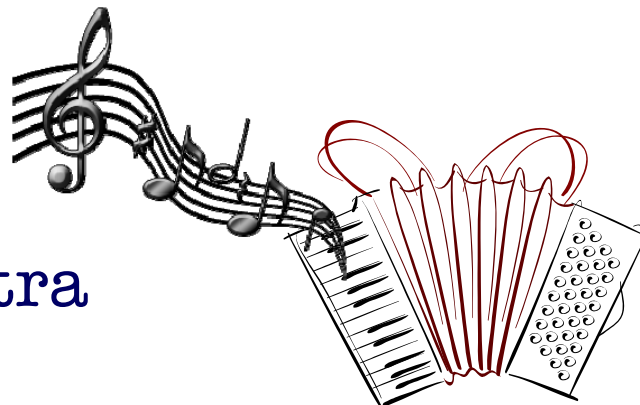




Second Sunday Concert Westmont Philharmonia Accordion Orchestra

Drop-in Scrapbooking Sundays, May 23 and June 27 1-4PM

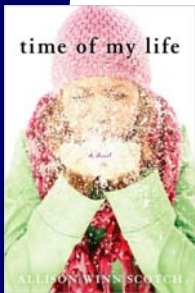


Want to catch up on your scrapbooking? We will provide the space to do it. Just bring your supplies and enjoy completing your projects with other scrappers. No registration needed.

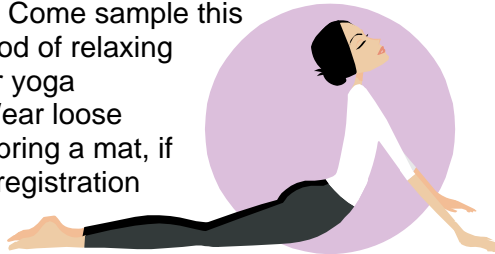


Book Discussion Group *Time of My Life* by Allison Winn Scotch. Thursday, June 24 7PM

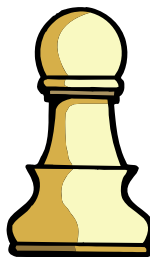
