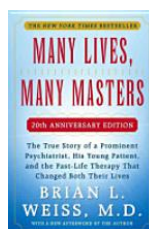

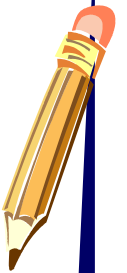


Teen Lockdown: Dodgeball Friday, September 30 7-9PM

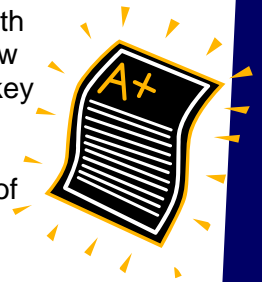


Banned Books Week Chat & Craft Wednesday, September 28 4PM

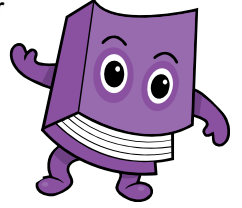

Preschool Storytime

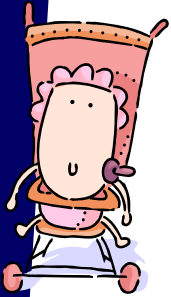

Baby Storytime

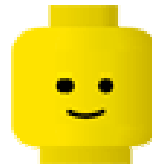

Congratulations to Kelly J., who won the grand prize for the teen summer reading club: a NOOK ereader!

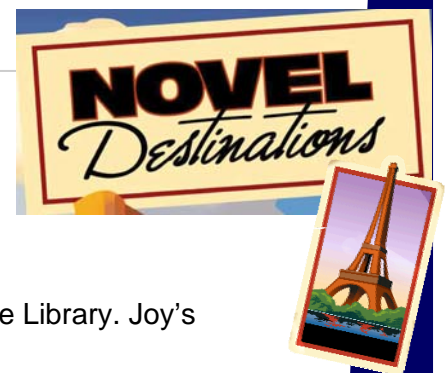
